

Stone House
This home dates to 1808 and 1830 and has period appropriate furnishings. Cooking, spinning, weaving, and quilting are demonstrated.

Springhouse
Original to the site, the springhouse was a source of water and used for keeping foods cool.

Oliver Miller Homestead
"Mansfield"
Circa 1772-1830

Forge
Used to make and repair tools and fixtures for both indoors and outdoors. A reproduction built in 1991.

Bee Hive Oven
Used for baking bread and pies and drying apples and other fruits and vegetables.

Shed
Used for demonstrations of chair making, tinsmithing, horning, and other pioneer skills.

Fire Pit
Used to demonstrate outdoor cooking and crafts such as candle making.

Log House
A reproduction of the type of home the Millers might have lived in during their early years. Furnished as a 1790's home. Built in 1988.

Barn
This reproduction of a typical Pennsylvania bank barn features exhibits on the Whiskey Rebellion, the movement west, and farm and house tools. A Trading Post sells items of interest and books on the period. Built in 2005.
